

## **Non-Motorized Transportation Advisory Committee**

*February 3, 2016 Meeting Notes*

The meeting was called to order at 7:05pm and adjourned at 9:05pm.

Minutes of the January 6, 2016 meeting were approved.

### Capital Improvements Project List

- There was extensive discussion of the draft 20-year project list and reviewed the rankings produced by Committee input. The Committee largely validated the rankings and proposed that Chris dropped several low-ranking projects and bring a revised and trimmed list to the Committee retreat later this month.

### City Engineer Report - Chris Hammer:

- Wyatt Way (Madison to Lovell) public involvement. SvR Design will be leading a public input session on the project on February 25 at 6:00 pm.

### Discussion:

- Pedestrian Safety on Point White Drive – Several community members attended the meeting to voice support for the maintenance of shoulder parking on Point White Road adjacent to Schel Schelb estuary; they provided a letter that is included in the minutes. The committee agreed that this issue should be studied further to find a way to accommodate both pedestrians and some automobile parking. The concern to provide for safe pedestrian movement in the area was noted, and several options exist to address this issue. The issue will be discussed further at the NMTAC Retreat.
- Transportation Element of Comp Plan – drafting of the Transportation element is proceeding nicely, and the document includes much of the policy & goals content previously drafted by NMTAC in the draft IWTP.
- Sakai Property Public Meeting – was held on January 23, and was well-attended. A wide variety of input regarding potential uses was provided.
- Wayne Roth noted that a speed limit proposal from City staff will be on the Council agenda for February 16. He also noted that the Winslow Merchants have provided funding for a bike repair station – it's in part a tribute to Dana Berg, and the proposed location is on Winslow Way at Madrone Lane, by the existing bike racks.

- The committee will have a retreat on February 24, at Yeomalt Cabin.

Public Comment:

- Charles Schmid noted that Spring Fling event will be held this year on Sunday, June 5 from noon-5:00. This is a Road Ends focused event in the vicinity of Murden Cove.
