Code Enforcement Complaints Will Now Go Through See, Click, Fix

As of November 1, the City of Bainbridge Island will begin transitioning to utilizing [See, Click, Fix](#) as the sole entry point for Code Enforcement complaints from the general public. The City hopes that the transition to See, Click, Fix will result in increased accessibility, transparency and accountability for code enforcement issues. The See, Click, Fix systems allows reporters to track their complaint's status online, while allowing other interested community members to easily be able to look up how the code enforcement investigation is progressing. By visiting the [City website](#) users can see issues that have been reported, when they were reported, and any comments from the Code Enforcement Officer or other relevant City staff.

During the transitional period, City staff will be happy to help train the public on how to utilize the system. Community members can utilize the See, Click, Fix system community through the [City website](#), at www.seeclickfix.com, or by downloading the See, Click, Fix app on their smart device. Users of the system can choose whether or not they'd like their name to be displayed on the public facing website.
