COMMUNITY INVITED TO HELP DESIGN PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLIST BRIDGE OVER SR 305

Bainbridge Island, Wash., (July, 2017) – Community members are encouraged to attend a meeting on Wednesday, July 26, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chamber to help inform the design of a bicycle-pedestrian bridge that would cross over SR 305 and connect with the Sound to Olympics (STO) Trail.

The City is in the process of moving forward with the early design of a pedestrian and bicycle bridge that would span SR305 connecting Knechtel Way with John Nelson Lane (near Vineyard Lane) and the STO Trail. The bridge would create a safe crossing opportunity for pedestrians and cyclists approximately mid-way between Winslow Way and High School Road. The City would like community members to assist in the design of the project to ensure that the bridge reflects the character of Bainbridge Island.

During the meeting community members can learn about the potential bridge project, discuss design opportunities and challenges, and provide initial feedback to help guide the design process. This meeting is the first in a series of public meetings planned for this project.
